Benny Benson, an Alaska Native seventh grader from the Jesse Lee Mission Home in Seward, won the Alaska Flag Contest in 1927. His simple but elegant design was selected from 142 entries. Benny's life changed forever, as he became a famous Alaskan within the state and across the country.





Make a five-pointed star by folding al piece of paper a few times and thenl making one cut.l

Fold a piece of paper In half.I Write the letters A, B, and C n it as shown in the Picture.I B is at the mid-point of thel folded paper.I

Fold corner **A** to point **B**.I Mark this hewly-formed corner **D**.I

Fold corner **C** ver the paperl edge running from **B** to **D** (along the dotted line).

Make another fold along the dotted line $\mathbf{D} - \mathbf{C}$.

Turn bver and but the paperl along a line from a pointl near bne edge to a pointl about two-thirds bf the way to the point **D** (the dotted line Illustrated bn the left).

Unfold the paper.l
